□ **Dan & Claudia Aanderud, WDO, Germany**

The Aanderuds were in Mexico City and Cuernavaca, visiting churches and cell groups that have supported their ministry over the years. They are also speaking at a conference and are encouraged to return to Hamburg, motivated to continue their church-planting ministry.

☐ **Steffan & Julie Pyle, Ethnos360, PNG**

The Pyles continue serving missionaries in remote areas of Papua New Guinea. Julie recently spent a week in a helicopter-access-only tribal location helping a missionary family with their children and schooling. Steffan has been flying regularly, completing over 50 hours in July while conducting medical evacuations, transporting missionaries, delivering supplies, and helping place missionaries in a new tribal area.

- Praise – Julie has had the opportunity to serve a missionary family in a remote tribal location by helping with their children and schooling.

- Pray – for Julie’s stamina and allergies, as well as wisdom as she ministers to the children and their parents.

☐ **Sohrab & Mitra Ramtin, Iranian Christian Church of SD**

Sohrab and Mitra continue to see encouraging opportunities to reach Iranians through online classes, discipleship, church ministry, and television and radio broadcasts. They are thankful for a new believer in Iran and for the 20 students they disciple across Iran, Europe, and Canada. They also continue developing leaders and responding to new contacts from Iran and Afghanistan.
