When I was a young mom, I thought the most important aspects of life were my well-being, my son's safety, and my career development. These were important to me because I grew up in chaos and felt a high need to prove myself over and over again. During a crisis in my own life, my neighbor invited me to church. After attending a few times, I felt genuine love, care, and concern from people I did not know. I had no real family to turn to, but these people were different. Two women took a personal interest in my growth; they prayed with me, helped me grasp who I was in Christ, and pointed me to Jesus and His Word.

Over time, the Bible came alive in a way I had never experienced, and everything began to change for the better. My focus shifted from myself to the magnificence of Jesus. Step by step, I came to realize that when Christ was glorified through my life, my well-being improved. As Jesus became bigger in my life, I became a better mom and friend. Committing my life to follow Him clarified my real purpose and showed me how I mattered in His plan. A new freedom rose within me as I felt the heaviness fall off my shoulders and back onto His. I had found true victory in Jesus!

One of the primary goals for Women's Ministry is to connect women to God, His Word, and women who will help them grow. In everything we do, we want women to discover that Jesus loves them. Our Girl Time event is designed to invite women to begin a life-changing relationship with the Savior who loves them and gave Himself for them. Our Coffee Connect events create opportunities for women to connect with other women who have a heart for the Lord. Our Bible studies encourage women to learn as much as they can about the God who created them and gave them the purpose to “Go and make disciples” (Matthew 28:19). Our discipleship ministry equips women to walk with Jesus and help other women do the same.
