Prayer: An Intimate Conversation With Our Joving Father

A man's daughter asked the local pastor if he would come and pray with her father because he was gravely ill. When the pastor arrived, he found the man lying in bed with his head propped up on two pillows and an empty chair beside his bed. The pastor assumed that the old fellow had been informed of his visit.

"I guess you were expecting me," he said. "No, who are you?"

"I'm the new Associate Pastor at First Baptist," the pastor replied.

"When I saw the empty chair, I figured you knew I was going to show up."

"Oh yeah, the chair," said the bedridden man.

"I've never told anyone this, not even my daughter," said the man.

"But all of my life I have never known how to pray. At church I used to hear the pastor talk about prayer, but it always went right over my head." "I abandoned any attempt at prayer," the old man continued, "until one day about four years ago my best friend said to me, 'Joe, prayer is just a simple matter of having a conversation with the Lord. Here's what I suggest. Sit down on a chair, place an empty chair in front of you and imagine your Heavenly Father on the chair. It's not weird because He promised in His word that He would always be with us.' 'Then just speak to Him and listen in the same way you're doing with me right now.'

"So, I tried it, and I've liked it so much that I do it a couple of hours every day. I'm careful, though. If my daughter saw me talking to an empty chair, she'd either have a nervous breakdown or send me off to the funny farm."

The pastor was deeply moved by the story. He prayed with the old man and returned to the church.

Two nights later the old man's daughter called to tell the pastor that her daddy had died.

As they talked, she described her daddy's last hours. "I needed to run some errands. Before I left the house, I went over to his bedside to tell him I'd be back. He told me one of his corny jokes and kissed me on the cheek. When I got back from the store an hour later, I found him dead. But there was something strange. Apparently, just before daddy died, he leaned over and rested his head on a chair beside the bed." —Author unknown

For many people, prayer is intimidating because they think prayer ought to be formal and eloquent. But Jesus taught us something radically different. He showed us that prayer is an intimate conversation with our loving Father, one marked by relationship, trust, honesty, and love. The story of the bedridden man and the empty chair beautifully illustrates this simplicity. Just as the man learned to talk to God as his Heavenly Father, we, too, are invited to approach God with that same closeness.

We see this clearly and profoundly in Jesus' prayers. Whenever He prayed, He always started with the word "Abba" to address His Father. In Mark 14:36, during His prayer in Gethsemane, Jesus cried, "Abba, Father, everything is possible for you. Take this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will."

The term "Abba" is an Aramaic word that conveys intimacy and affection, much like our English equivalent, "Daddy" or "Papa." He not only approached the Father like this, but He taught and expected His followers to do the same.

When Jesus' disciples asked Him to teach them to pray, He began with "Our Father (Abba) in heaven" (Matthew 6:9). Through this simple opening, Jesus revealed that prayer is not about distant, ritualistic communication but about drawing near to God as our loving Father.

When we don't pray like this, prayer becomes drudgery—an empty, difficult, and joyless exercise. And worse, we are in danger of praying the kind of prayers Jesus warned against in Matthew 6:7-"vain repetitions" or "trying to be heard for our many words."

The Bible explicitly reminds us that our Father-God is eager to hear from us. He cares deeply about us and invites us to call Him "Abba"—bringing our thoughts, fears, and joys to Him. And just as the man in the story rested his head on the chair, symbolizing his trust in Jesus, we can lean into God's presence, knowing He is always there, lovingly listening.
