Death and Life are in the Power of the Tongue

Earlier this year I was in South Dakota on a pheasant hunt. We hunted in the mornings and spent our evenings sitting around for Bible study and sharing. One night an older man with a heavy Louisiana drawl began to share. You could hear the weight in his voice before you even knew what he was carrying. He told us about the hardest thing he has ever had to do. About 20 years into his marriage, he had to commit his wife to a psychiatric hospital because she was suicidal and deeply depressed. As they took her away, she was screaming at him. Over and over she cried, “I hate you. How could you do this to me. I hate you.” It shattered him. He stood there broken, feeling like he had betrayed the woman he loved most. On the ride home, through tears he cried out to the Lord. And the Lord answered him with a verse.

Death and life are in the power of the tongue. —Proverbs 18:21

Through that verse, God showed him something he had never seen before. Even though he deeply loved his wife, the way they talked about her was always shaped by her pain—her traumatic upbringing, the abuse, her abandonment, her baggage, the scars and the problems. Everything was framed by what was wrong and what might go wrong.

He made a decision right then and there that he would stop speaking from fear and sight and start speaking from faith. He would speak to his wife the way God saw her and the way Scripture described her. Every time he visited her in the hospital he told her how beautiful she was inside and out. He told her she was a good wife and a good mother. Then he started saying something that really made her angry. You are perfect. She would push back and say, “stop saying that, I am not perfect.” But he kept saying it anyway. After she came home and things began to stabilize, the Lord spoke to him again during his prayer time and gave him another verse.

Perfect love casts out all fear. —1 John 4:18

In that moment God revealed something deeper. One of his wife’s greatest fears was that one day he would leave her because she was too broken. She felt unworthy of him because he was such a good man and that he would abandon her eventually. So, he went to her, took her hands, looked her straight in the eyes, and said, “no matter what happens, no matter what you do, no matter what we go through, I am never leaving you. I love you with all my heart and I am here for life.”

From that point on, by the grace of God he stayed faithful to those two verses. For days, weeks, and months he spoke life and security over her. He did it at home and in public and even in front of other people. We all chuckled as he told us he would introduce her as “his perfect wife,” which always earned him an elbow in the ribs. But he did not stop. About six months later they were sitting in their living room talking when it hit them both at the same time. She was different. Peace had replaced fear. Her trauma no longer controlled her. Somewhere along the way she had come to believe him and she was free. Her upbringing had been deeply traumatic with abuse and abandonment, but those things no longer had the final word. Then he said something I’ll never forget. He said “I would never want to go through that again but I certainly would, if it meant having my wife back and the marriage we have now. She is so radiant and full of joy and we love each other so much, we are best friends.”

I have not been able to shake that story!

First, because it is such a clear picture of how God speaks to us. In Christ, God does not define us by our wounds or our failures or our past. Because of Jesus, His righteousness is credited to us. We are seen as loved, whole, and secure. And God makes us the same promise that husband made to his wife.

I will never leave you nor forsake you. —Hebrews 13:5

Second, it has challenged me to think about how I speak to my wife, my kids, the people I work with, and even to myself. Am I speaking life or reinforcing fear. Am I naming what is broken or declaring what God says is true. As we step into a new year, maybe one of the most powerful commitments we can make is to speak life in our homes, our marriages, over our children, at work and in our own minds.

Let's speak life in 2026!
