The Constancy of Our Prayers

Often when we talk about prayer, we're talking about seeing God work to change something. Consider this—we pray more when life is tough than when it's great. We pray more when we're poor than when we're rich, and less when life is good than when it's rough. We pray because there are situations that we have no control over, and divine intervention seems to be the only solution. Oswald Chamber writes, "We tend to use prayer as a last resort, but God wants it to be our first line of defense. We pray when there's nothing else we can do, but God wants us to pray before we do anything at all."

Paul reminds Timothy to *Pray without ceasing*, 1 Timothy 5:17.

More and more our culture is inundated with a constant stream of information—from the news feeds on social media, to notifications and alerts on our phones, it's possible to know what's going on with who, pretty much all the time. But it's easy in all this constant noise to miss the voice of God. So, we have to make it a practice to engage in prayer—in communication—with God. And the Bible challenges us to keep the line open all the time—to "pray without ceasing." That means not only can we talk to God whenever we need to, but we can hear from God whenever we need to.

God wants us to have a vital and effective prayer life. He encourages us to pray, and not just when we're in trouble, but as the guiding force of our lives. To seek God in all places, about all things. Corrie Ten Boom asks, "Is prayer your steering wheel or your spare tire?" My challenge to you is this —pursue God in prayer. Make it as much a part of your life as breathing. Keep your relationship with God close and right so that you can go to him whenever you need and receive from him whatever he sends. Francis of Assisi said, "We should seek not so much to pray but to *become* prayer."

It's so vital to maintain a connection with God through prayer. If there's something I'm usually uncomfortable doing, it's reaching out to people I hardly know. Asking a stranger for help is hard. Sharing intimate struggles with someone you hardly know is hard. And seeking the guidance, blessing, and grace from a God who you rarely spend any time with becomes awkward. So, maintain a relationship with Him by staying in communication. Pray to Him and listen to what he's saying back. Consider that person you text most throughout the day—even the little things. What would it look like to maintain that level of intentionality with God?

The church of God, and the lives of its people will be transformed by ceaseless, effective prayer. Martin Luther said, "No one can believe how powerful prayer is and what it can effect, except those who have learned it by experience. Whenever I have prayed earnestly, I have been heard and have obtained more than I prayed for. God sometimes delays, but He always comes."

May our lives be shaped by the constancy of our prayers, and the closeness of our relationship with God.
