Prayer and Faithful Obedience

And we prayed to our God and set a guard as a protection against them day and night. Nehemiah 4:9

The book of Nehemiah records the exciting record of Israel's return from their Babylonian captivity. Nehemiah and his contemporary Ezra led the people back to Jerusalem where they found it in physical and spiritual shambles. Called and convinced that God had appointed them to restore the city, Nehemiah set out to rebuild the wall around the city, protecting the inhabitants from outside dangers. But in the process, the construction project faced opposition from those who knew that a fortified Jerusalem was an independent Jerusalem, and that once the walls were up, it would be much harder to take advantage of the people. Nehemiah records:

But when Sanballat and Tobiah and the Arabs and the Ammonites and the Ashdodites heard that the repairing of the walls of Jerusalem was going forward and that the breaches were beginning to be closed, they were very angry. And they all plotted together to come and fight against Jerusalem and to cause confusion in it. And we prayed to our God and set a guard as a protection against them day and night. **Nehemiah 4:7-9**

What's important to catch here is that while Israel relied on the Lord for their protection, they also took responsibility for their actions. They prayed and set a guard. They asked God for help, and took up arms in their defense. I think it's easy to pray to God and then stand there and wait for an answer, but that's not necessarily how the Lord works. God allows us to partner with him in our prayer, acting in a way that reveals our belief that if we take the right steps in the direction of our desires, God will lead us where we need to go.

Trust God and lock your doors.

The decision to set a guard wasn't a sign the people didn't trust God; it was taking responsibility for the situation they were in and recognizing that prayer doesn't mean we sit passively on the sidelines and ignore the dangers presented to us. God often grants us victory, while still expecting us to fight the battle. God often answers prayers through the process of our efforts.

Someone once said, "pray like it all depends on God, but work like it all depends on you." In the end it does all depend on God, but there is something to be said about taking active steps towards what it is you are asking from the Lord.

Praying for a job and submitting applications.

Praying for a relationship and going on dates.

Praying for wisdom and seeking wise counsel.

Praying for financial blessings and being a good steward of your gifts.

Prayer, coupled with faithful obedience, will lead to God's blessings. What are you praying for, and what are you doing about it?
